Benefits Of Dental Implants

Implant dentistry is the most advanced and clinically successful therapy available to replace a missing tooth or teeth.

Improved Quality Of Life

- The ability to enjoy a wide variety of foods
- No need for messy dental adhesives
- Implants are cared for just like natural teeth

Better Health


- Improve chewing and therefore, aid in digestion

Replacing your missing teeth with a fixed bridge treatment option versus dental implant solutions will require permanent changes to adjacent natural teeth.

To create a fixed bridge to replace a single missing tooth, we must grind down adjacent healthy teeth to support a fixed bridge. This may compromise the life expectancy of the supporting teeth due to the permanent changes to the tooth structure.

Additionally, there are other risk factors such as bacterial access to the supporting teeth, which can lead to dental decay and gum disease, as well as possible oral bone and tissue loss.

Unlike a fixed bridge, replacing a single missing tooth with dental implants limits the compromise to the surrounding natural teeth.



Dental Implants Support More Than Just a Single Tooth



Implant retained dentures are secured in place onto two or more dental implants by attachments that connect to the implant. The attachments allow you to have control over when your teeth are removed for easy daily care.



Implant bar supported dentures are secured to a custom support bar with clip attachments placed in your replacement teeth. The attachments allow you to have control over when your teeth are removed for easy daily care.



Implant supported fixed dentures are replacement teeth secured in place by screws on top of the foundation provided by dental implants. This option is fixed and only your dentist has control over when your replacement teeth can be removed.

FAQs about dental implants

What are dental implants?

Dental implants are substitutes for the roots of missing teeth. They act as an anchor for a replacement tooth or crown or a set of replacement teeth. A Dental Implant is a highly specialized cylinder of titanium that is placed in the jaw bone under the gum. Being extremely biocompatible with the body, it has bone forming around it to fuse the implant to the bone. Once the implant is successfully placed, it is used to support a crown, bridge or a complete or partial denture.

Am I a candidate for implants?

Implant patients are of all ages and implants may be the right choice for anyone missing one or more teeth due to injury, disease or decay. They are especially practical for patients who can no longer wear removable dentures. We can determine if you are a candidate for dental implants after a careful evaluation of your dental and medical history.

Do I have enough bone?

It is important for a patient to have enough bone to support the implant. If you do not have enough bone, there are many safe and effective ways to correct bone deficiency. We will assess this and advise you if additional bone material is needed.

How long does treatment take?

Treatment time can vary depending on your needs. Each situation needs a separate evaluation; upon evaluation we will be able to give you an approximate timetable. The usual time period would be 3-6 months.

What are the costs involved?

Our **introductory rate** for a single tooth replacement (inclusive of implant placement surgery and crown) is \$2000. Additional costs may be involved if bone grafting is required.

In comparison to a 3 unit bridge which would involve crowning 2 adjacent teeth to replace one missing tooth (cost \$3000), this a way better option considering the benefits of implants listed on the previous page.

Will my insurance provider cover any of the above costs?

Every insurance plan is different; however, in our experience, the cost of implant surgery, placement and bone grafting will most likely not be covered. What may be covered either fully or partly will most likely be the crown or denture.

What are the advantages of implants?

They do not get cavities!!!! The implant behaves as your natural tooth does and improves your chewing efficiency. Does not need adjacent teeth to be trimmed as you would need to in a bridge to replace a missing tooth in between existing teeth.

What are the disadvantages of implants?

They can get gum disease and need the same care that your natural teeth do with regular checkup and cleaning. The implant is placed surgically, so there are some of the risks of surgery such as bleeding, infection, bruising, numbness, etc.

Invest in yourself and get your confidence back!



DENTAL DO'S

Brush twice a day, first thing in the morning and last thing in the night.

Include flossing, it is so worth the time and effort.

Avoid snacking on refined carbohydrates. Chips, candy, white bread and other processed foods and drinks are highly cariogenic and can cause cavities.

Eat a diet rich in vitamins and fiber, its not only good for your gums and teeth, but also overall for your body.

Be diligent about your dental check up and cleaning appointments.
